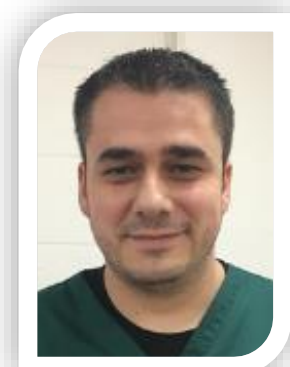
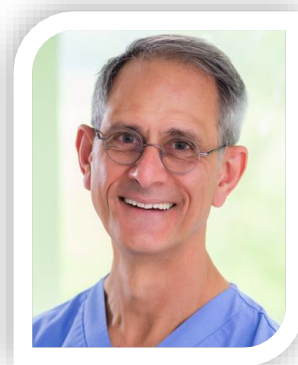

Byre Veterinary Referrals, Peterborough**

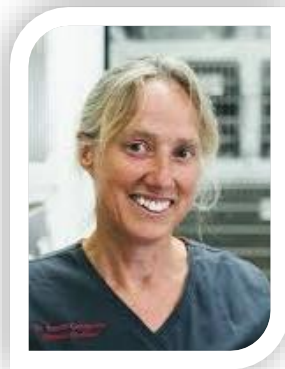

**BVSc Cert SAS, MRCVS**

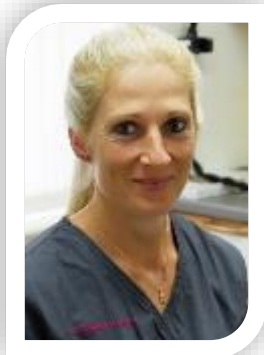
**RCVS Advanced Practitioner in Small Animal Surgery, Clinical Director,
